Dear Commander Ellis-Graham and Brothers of the Department of New York:

Please let this serve as the report of the Proceeding Committee. The Proceedings Committee was appointed by Department Order# 13 on October 29, 2015 to fulfill the resolution approved at the 131<sup>st</sup> Department Encampment to try to reconstruct the proceedings for the years 2010-2013, which had been lost as a result of the resignation of the then Department Secretary. These would be the Encampments held in Newark, New York in 2010, Albany, New York in 2011, Newburgh, New York in 2012 and Ithaca, New York in 2013. As anyone who has been involved in preparing the proceedings for just one Department Encampment with recorded minutes knows, it involves a lot of work, trying to reconstruct proceedings for 4 encampments without any such recorded minutes is daunting.

However, I have now located a number of documents from my own records which would assist in doing at least a adequate job but I am still missing a lot. Last year we recommended that this Committee be continued and that the Department Commander place a solicitation in the very next edition of the Volunteer, which would be the Summer edition, seeking copies of Camp and Department Officers reports for those missing years. However, no summer edition was published and the solicitation for reports was also never placed in the Winter Edition as requested. So none of those records have been provided. So, the work is not yet done. Therefore, we would therefore once again recommend that the next Department Commander continue this committee in an effort to complete this work. In addition, we would request that the next Department Commander place in the next edition of the Volunteer a solicitation to all camps and officers who served during those years to provide copies of any Encampment reports they have to the Committee. In addition, I cannot stress enough that it is important that the newsletter be published consistently per the Bylaws and that the Department Commander insure that that is accomplished.

#### Recommendations:

- 1. The Proceedings Committee to reconstruct the proceedings for 2010-2013 be continued.
- 2. That a solicitation be placed in the next edition of the Volunteer seeking copies of all camp reports, Department officer reports and Department Committee reports for the committee.

Dear Commander Ellis-Graham and Brothers of the Department of New York,

*April 25*, *2016*, Received phone call from Senator Amedore, Legislative Director, Kaitlyn McLeod informing the committee that the line item directed for \$150,000 for flag preservation failed to be included in the 2016 budget.

The Senator's Office is still working to secure funding for the Battle Flag Collection, but as of now there will be no money allocated to the preservation and storage of the New York State Battle Flag Collection.

This is how last year's Flag Committee Report ended and I'm afraid to report that this year's report ends the same way, that the line item directed again for \$ 150,000 for flag preservation failed to be included in the 2017 budget.

#### Dear Commissioner Harvey:

I respectfully request your assistance in securing funding for the preservation of the New York State Battle Flag Collection located in the New York State Military Museum and Veterans Research Center in Saratoga Springs NY.

New York State has an extensive battle flag collection. Currently there are one thousand five hundred (1500) battle flags that need to be restored and preserved. There are about 500 battle flags from the 19<sup>th</sup> century that are deteriorating at a rapid rate. These flags need to be restored and preserved as soon as possible or we risk losing them. Each battle flag costs between S 8,000 and S 12,000 to repair and archive. This dedicated funding will enable the museum staff to begin working on preserving the oldest battle flags in our collection.

Thank you in advance for your consideration. Please do not hesitate to contact my office if you need additional information.

The above request was again a dead end, as no funding was available from the Office of Parks and Recreation. (Just a reminder that the New York State, Office of Parks, Recreation and *Historic Preservation*, are the people that do the preservation work on the flags for the New York State Military Museum which falls under New York State Department of Military and Naval Affairs.) needless to say an never ending problem, like trying to deal with a brainless three headed monster.

June 15, 2016 "Rally Round the Flags Committee" Richard Straight met at the New York State Military Museum in Saratoga with curator Chris Morton and asked for a list of the remaining flags that needed to be preserved, he explained he would have to get permission from the director before making the list available. The Committee finally received the list of the National and Regimental flags six months after my request.

**November 17, 2016** Received list of over 500 National and Regimental Flags listed for preservation when funding becomes available. List of Flags attached.

January 28, 2017 "Rally Round the Flags Committee" met to deliberate ways to increase backing within the New York State Senate and Assembly for conserving and storage of the flag collection. We decided to create a data base listing the 500 flags that still need to be conserved, the Data base will connect each of the flags with regimental number, what townships and cities within those counties each company or regiment was recruited in and mustered into US Service. Using Records Compiled and listed in Phisterer's, New York in the War of the Rebellion 1861-1865, The Communities of New York and the Civil War, The Recruiting Areas of New York Civil War Regiments. Each of the 500 flags will have a home area where the regiment was raised. Those areas will now be identifiable to each flag or flags needed to be preserved. In writing to Senator or Assemblymen asking for their support we will be able to personalize our request by including a list of regiments/flags within their voting district that need preservation. We will also collect information on each County Legislature and cities in the state, and will notify them of the need to save the collection and ask for their support. The committee is researching and collecting information to add to our Data base.

# Department of New York Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War Memorial/Monument Fund

Objective: The purpose of the Department Memorial/Monument Grant Fund is twofold:

- To assist Camps in their efforts to rehabilitate memorials and monuments related to the Civil War, Grand Army of the Republic (GAR), the Sons of Union Veterans (SUV) or the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War (SUVCW) and
- 2. to provide in-kind dollars that can be used to acquire grant funding from the National SUVCW or supplement that funding source.

This grant fund is open to the preservation and restoration of Civil War monuments and memorials as well as for the support of projects involving the production of new monuments. However, the funding priority always will be for:

- 1. the preservation of existing monuments
- and specifically those monuments in the greatest distress.

Process: Requests for funds will be accepted after the annual Department Encampment beginning on 1 June of the Encampment year (year 1), continuing into the new year until 28 February (year 2). The grant committee is authorized to evaluate submitted requests and make recommendations for awards, through their chairperson, to the currently seated Commander. Recommendations must be submitted by 1 April in year 2. Awards will be made prior to the next Department Encampment where the appropriate announcement will be made by the currently seated Department Commander. The seated committee, the Commander and the Department are under no obligation to make an award in any given funding year if there are no proposals found to merit a monetary award. In the event of work delays, successive committees and Commanders are required to honor the decisions and awards made by their predecessors.

Note: Any requests that are made, and postmarked, after midnight of the 28 February submission date shall be held for consideration in the next funding cycle. The submission will be considered by the newly assembled committee and recommended to the newly elected Department Commander.

**Guidelines:** The following provides some general guidelines on how grant submittals will be evaluated:

- 1. Any New York SUVCW Camp in good standing may request money from this fund.
- 2. Having more complete information in the application/request will improve the possibility of funding. Providing photographs, explanations of work or unusual conditions, copies of all

## PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE BYLAWS OF THE DEPARTMENJT OF NEW YORK, SUVCW PROPOSED BY THE DEPARTMENT TREASURER TO THE 134th ENCAMPMENT

That the Department enact a new Article XVIII entitled Members, Associates, Juniors and Junior Associates under the Age of 18 as follows:

- Section 1. The Department of New York and its Camps shall comply with all the Rules, Regulations, and Orders of the National Organization in regards restrictions established for the monitoring of Brothers under the age of 18 while interacting within the Department of New York and its Camps. They shall include as a minimum the following:
  - A. All Brothers under the age of 18 years of age shall be accompanied by a parent or person designated as a Guardian (Grandfather, Brother over the age of 18 years, Uncle, or legally appointed guardian) when participating in any SUVCW activity.
  - B. At no time will a non-related Brother be permitted 'one on one' contact with a Brother under the age of 18. Any interaction with a Brother under the age of 18 must include at least two (2) Brothers over the age 18 at all times.
  - C. Any Brother who witnesses or suspects in good faith any type of physical, mental, or sexual abuse of any member under the age of 18 will immediately report such suspicion to local authorities first and local Camp and Department Commanders immediately.
  - D. Every Brother over the age of 18 who may have contact with a Brother under the age of 18 is strongly encouraged but not required to complete training related to protecting children from abuse of any type. (Training is available at no cost online from the Boy Scouts of America through their Youth Protection Training at the relation of America through their Youth Protection Training at the relation of America through their Youth Protection training. It takes about 30 minutes to complete. Upon completion, you will be able to print a certificate along with a wallet-size certification card which is good for a period of 2 years.)
  - E. All Brothers shall comply with all applicable Local and State laws pertaining to child abuse.
