A NY Brother in a podcast

Brother Anton Schwarzmueller of Abraham Lincoln Camp # 6 was invited to participate in a podcast hosted by David Lander, Historian of the State of New York, about the apprehension of Confederate spy and guerrilla John Yates Beall (pronounced "Bell") and his cohort on 16 Dec 1864.

The podcast was recorded via Zoom on January 8th and published later. It was sponsored by the William G. Pomeroy Foundation. The Foundation provided the grant for a historical marker acquired by the Niagara Frontier Chapter of the National Railway Historical Society. The historical marker commemorates the arrests of the two Confederates by a local policeman, preventing them from escaping back to Canada after a failed attempt to derail a passenger train. They had been waiting for a train to take them across the Niagara Railway Suspension Bridge.

The historical marker was dedicated in May of last year. It stands at the entrance to the Amtrak Station in Niagara Falls, which is also the entrance to the 1863 former U.S. Custom House occupied today by the Niagara Falls Underground Railroad Heritage Museum. Here is the link to the podcast.

Marilyn Elizabeth Rowsey-Dirk, age 81 entered her eternal rest in the arms of Jesus on March 7, 2024, at Upstate University Hospital after a brief illness.

Marilyn was the only child born of her parents Harry Edward Rowsey and Helen Leona Dawson Plogger. Born in Lexington, Virginia, Marilyn moved to Oswego as a child and attended Oswego schools. There she met the love of her life; David and they were happily married for 49 years before his passing in 2011, seven months short of their 50th wedding anniversary.

Marilyn was an active participant in the Daughters of Union Veterans of the Civil War, Lodema Strickland Tent #56 (Ontario, NY) and was past NYS president-elect of the DUVCW. She was an avid civil war reenactor, travelling to Gettysburg, PA

annually for the Remembrance Day parade in November and participating in local living history events. She was often seen portraying Dr. Mary Edward Walker and Belle Boyd, a Confederate spy. Marilyn was also an avid genealogist, collecting family pictures, lore, and historical records to pass down to her grandchildren. She often thought of it as a treasure hunt and loved finding new cousins and stories to share. Marilyn enjoyed politics and was also an election inspector for many years for the Republican party.

She was predeceased by her husband of 49 years, David Lee Dirk and her sister, Donna Rowsey Floyd. She is survived by her four daughters, Samantha Golden, Rebecca Dirk, Claudette (Michael) Sharrow and Melinda (Gregory) Standish, brothers Gary (Lisa) Rowsey and Ricky (Leeta) Rowsey, as well as seven grandchildren: Jared Golden, Brittani Boyer, Chase (Jamie) Golden, Alexander Munger, Tristen Munger, Carson Golden and Hunter Kaplan.

In lieu of flowers, donations can be made to the Brain Injury Association of New York State (BIANYS), the American Heart Association or the National Kidney Foundation in Marilyn's name. The burial will be at Riverside Cemetery at a later date, where she will join her "Shatzy" in eternal rest. As Marilyn would say, "Bye for now" until we meet again.
